Social video chatting is a form of streaming video that's popular among teens and tweens. In addition to using this capability on Facebook, Snapchat and Instagram, kids can download apps such as Houseparty, AirTime and Perioscope to use for this purpose.



Such apps are great for conversations with friends, but they come with risks: kids may spend too much time video chatting and not enough doing important activities like homework. They may feel pressured into oversharing or be exposed to mature content they are not emotionally equipped to handle. There are also adult predators trying to take advantage of the anonymity of these apps.

When to Reboot Your Router and When to Replace It

It seems too simple, but one of the easiest ways to fix a wide variety of technical issues is to simply reboot (or restart) the device, including your router. This is because routers are like small computers that use memory, a

processor and an operating system. And like your computer, routers also benefit from a fresh start every now and then.

For example, if your Internet service goes down at your home, the first thing to try is to reboot your wireless router. It's a quick process that will often take care of the problem.

- 1. Unplug your router from it's power outlet (don't just turn it off).
- 2. Wait about 2 minutes, then plug it back in.
- 3. Allow the device a minute or two to turn back on.

If your Wi-Fi problems persist, or you are rebooting frequently, it might be time for you to get a new router. With the increasing number of Internet-connected devices in homes today, "old school" routers may not be up to the demands. New routers can effectively handle 20 or more devices versus 2-3 devices on old routers.

Another consideration is the speed of your Internet service. Some older routers have a speed cap that limits the maximum speed possible, which means your old router may be preventing you from receiving the full benefit of the Internet plan you are paying for. Call us at 796-4411 to learn more.
